Topic: NZ Web Application Security Stats 2013 or What Value a Pentest Can

Show?

The talk will introduce one of the first attempts to have a statistical view of web application vulnerabilities in New Zealand. It is based on real findings from penetration testing of web applications developed or used by different New Zealand organisations in 2013. We try to answer such questions like:

· Which vulnerabilities are most popular?

- What is an average risk of a discovered vulnerability?
- Which industry sectors are most affected?

Some reasoning about how to gain best value from penetration testing will be also presented: what is the best to do before the test, during and after it.

Sergey Ozernikov has 10 years of experience in IT industry with the last 7 years specialising in information security. He worked in different commercial and government organisations in Russia with the main focus on establishing of effective information security policies and processes.
