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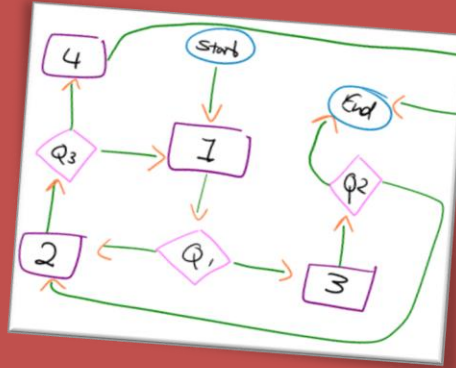

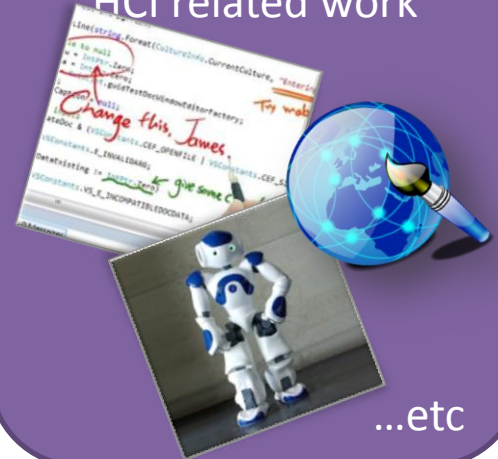

# Collaboration

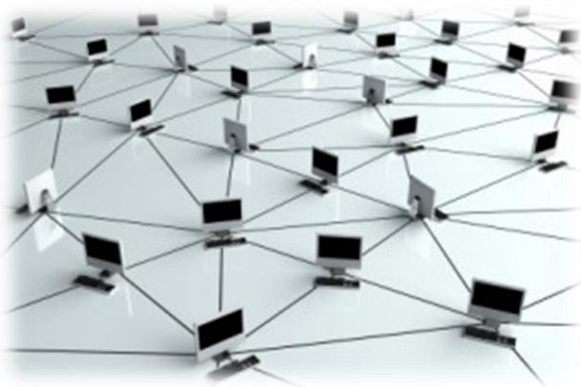
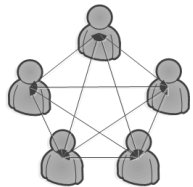


A broader range of knowledge, skills, and opinions to draw from.

# Large Scale Collaboration

## Informational Perspective:

*More people is GOOD.*

A broader range of knowledge, skills, and opinions to draw from.

## Social Categorization Perspective:

*More is BAD.*

Differences -> subgroups -> conflict and “us versus them” dynamic

- Collaborative filtering: Amazon
- Collective intelligence: IMDb, Digg
- Collaborating to create something...?

# Case study: Wikipedia

A free encyclopedia built collaboratively



**Rules**

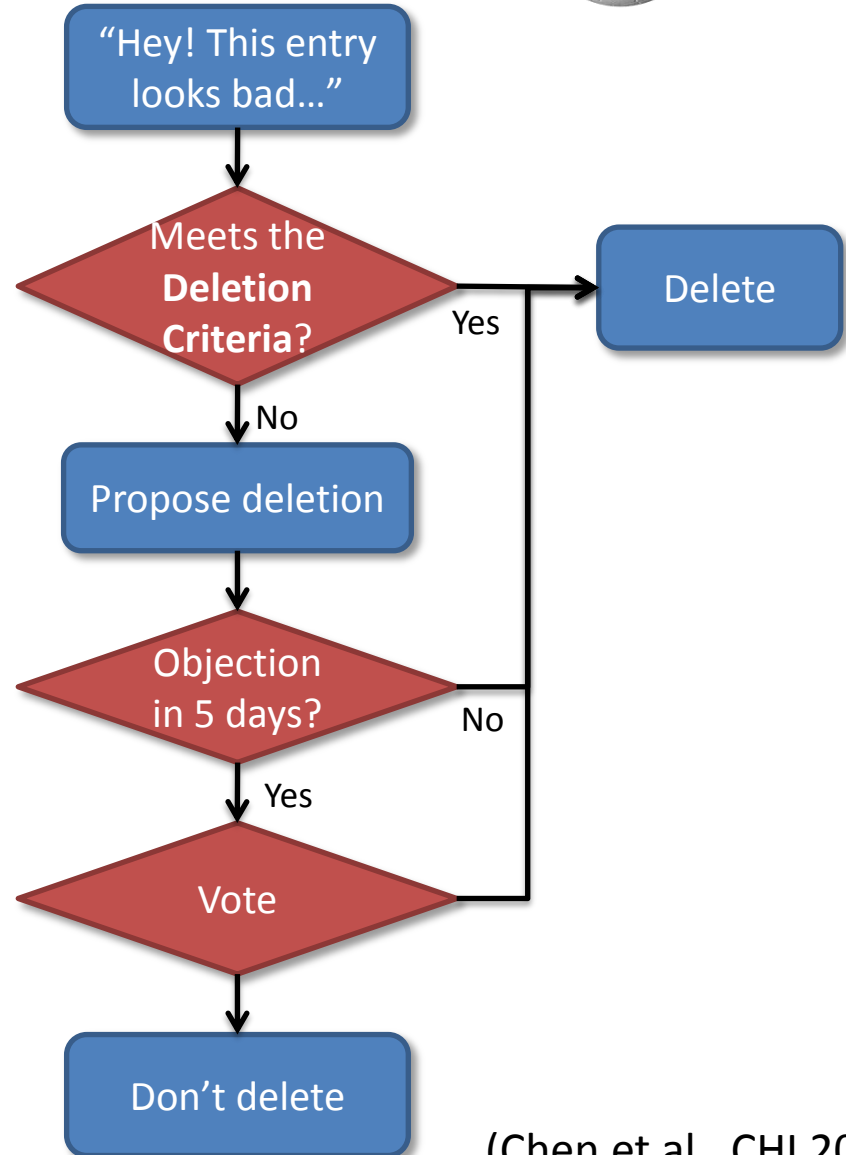
1. Deletion criteria
2. 5 days objection time
3. Vote

The leader makes the **final decision** based on the feedbacks.

Weee weee!! We win!!  
We saved Wikipedia  
again!!



We lose.. This is ridiculous..  
Wikipedia is not trustworthy..  
We are not coming back...



# Case Study: Newgrounds

Creative community on Flash works



- “Hey I have a brilliant idea!”
  - “And I have broken it down to these five pieces, now if each of you can complete one of them, **Our Collaboration** will create this wonderful product...”

Yes we are totally  
COLLABORATING!!!



No they don't feel that way. They feel isolated. (Luther & Bruckman, CSCW 2008)



# Case Study: A Million Penguins

To write a novel on a wiki platform (by Penguin Books)



- “Can a community write a novel?”
  - Without interrupting the creativity?
  - **Failure as a novel**
    - No community
    - No recognizable novel
  - **Successful performance**
    - Carnival instead of novel

- 07/02/01 – 07/03/01
- 75,000 views from different people in a month
- 1,476 registered users
  - 44.6 % participated
- 11,000 edits
  - 42% on Welcome page

- Lots of conflicts and changing
- Not a setting communities can form
- Better if one can edit his page alone
- Very little sign of collaborative work
- Promising start ruined by fart jokes
- Suggestion on locking the novel

Can we have a system which allows the ideas to grow while avoiding the problem of conflict?

	Criteria	Description
1	Diversity of opinion	Allowing different opinions to exist
2	Independence	Not thinking as a group
3	Decentralization	Can specialize and draw on local knowledge
4	Aggregation	Mechanism to turn private decision to collective

- Collaboration:

- You are able to affect the outcome
- You have to consider the others

- Conflict resolving

- Your idea will not be ignored just because 51% people hate it
