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Woodford's 25 Steps (reduced to 18)

- 1. Decide on a topic
- 2. Write the title & synopsis
- 3. Review requirements
- 4. Decide on the basic form of the article
- 5. ... (see handout)

2. Topic, Title, Synopsis

- How many of you have settled on a topic?
- Have you written a title and a thesis sentence (or a synopsis)?
- A synopsis is an explanation of your "projected paper in definite and concise terms, as though to a friend who asks [you] at some chilly street corner what [you] have been up to recently."
